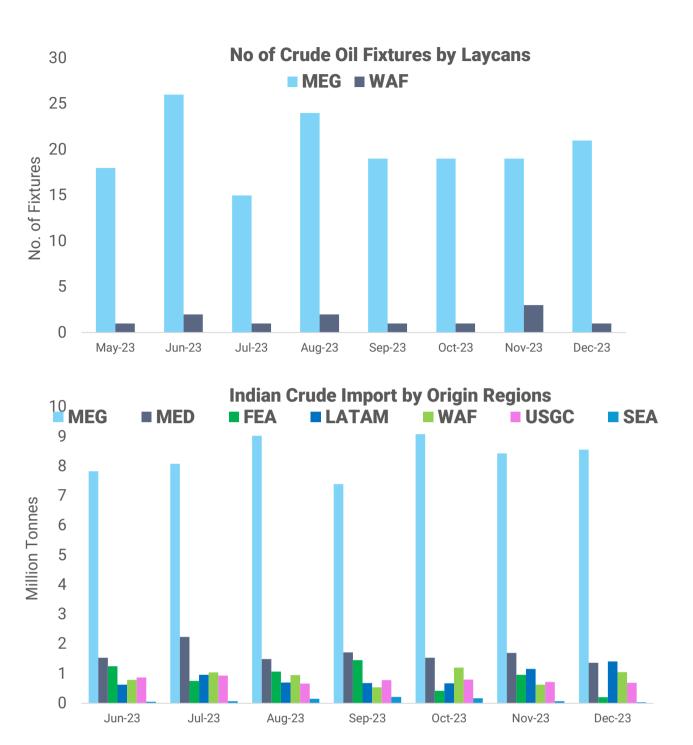

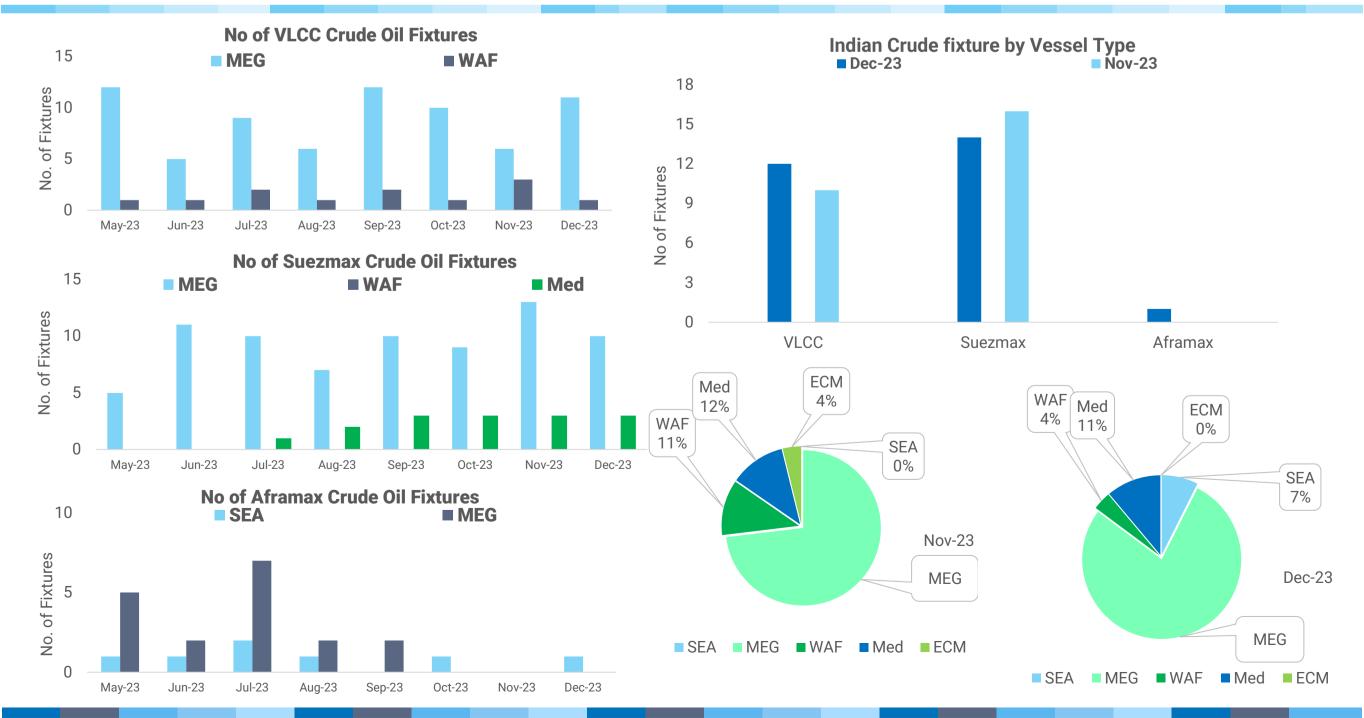

# Crude Tankers Spot Fixtures Trend



- Last month, a total of 21 of Middle East Gulf (ex-MEG)-India crude oil fixtures were recorded, marking a modest uptick of 2 fixtures compared to the previous month. Particularly noteworthy was the surge in Very Large Crude Carrier (VLCC) fixtures, with a notable increase of 5 VLCCs month-on-month (m/m), totaling 11 fixtures during the period. The overall landscape for VLCC fixtures also exhibited a positive trajectory, reaching 12 VLCCs, a discernible rise from the 10 fixtures recorded in the prior month. Conversely, Suezmax fixtures experienced a decline, contracting by 2 fixtures in the month of December 2023.
- Shifting focus to India's crude oil dynamics, there was a notable 3 percent increase in crude oil imports from Russia during December as compared to the preceding month. Specifically, India imported 1.52 million barrels per day (bpd) of Russian crude oil in December, up from 1.48 million bpd in November. Remarkably, Russia solidified its position as the primary supplier of crude oil to India during the final month of the year.

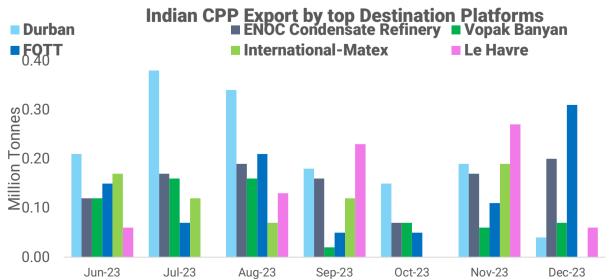
# Indian CPP Imports Trend by Category

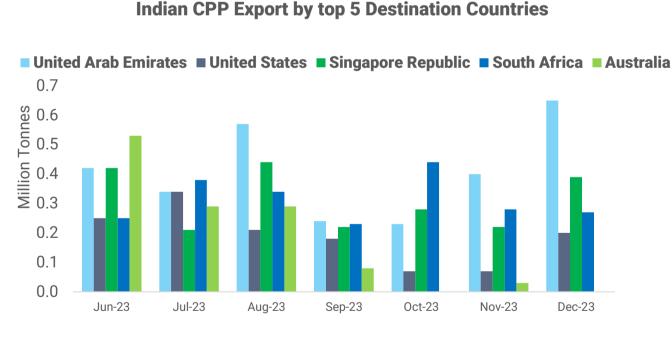


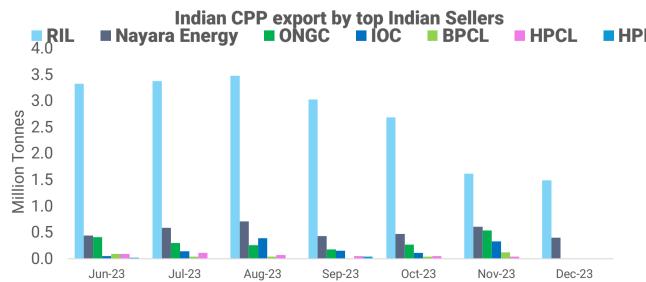


## Indian CPP Exports Trend by Category

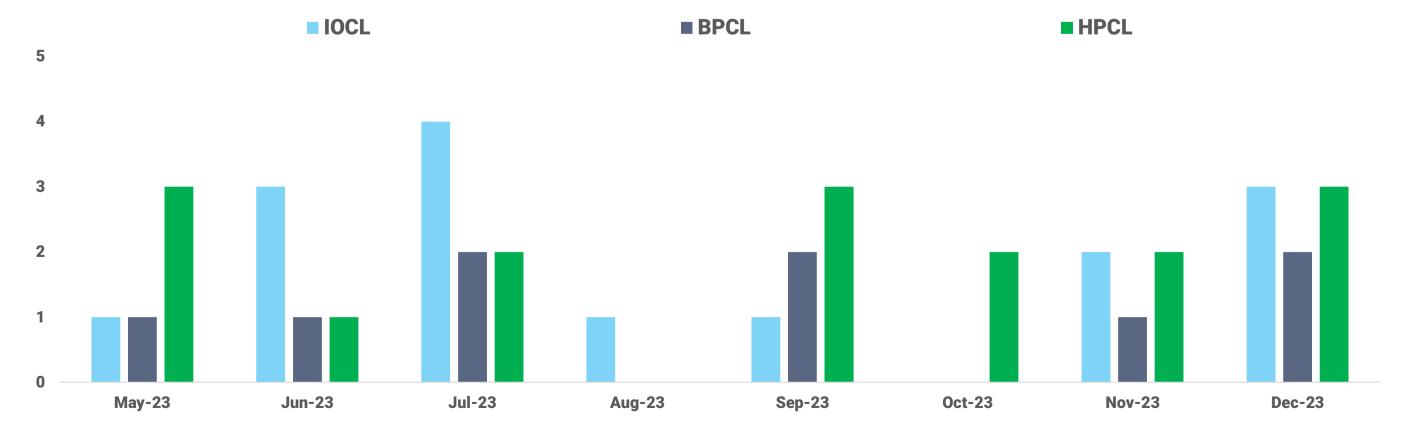

#### MARKET UPDATES: CPP

#### India's fuel demand hits seven-month high in December

- India's fuel consumption rose to a seven-month high in December to about 20.054 million metric tons, data from the Petroleum Planning and Analysis Cell (PPAC) of the oil ministry showed.
- Total consumption, a proxy for oil demand, in December rose by 6.2% from 18.89 million tons in November. It was up around 2.6% compared with the same period a year earlier.
- Due to the festive season, demand has been growing at a rapid rate in recent month. Demand will continue to increase but the growth could be slower, as 2023 has been a strong year," said LSEG analyst Ehsan Ul Haq.
- Sales of diesel, mainly used by trucks and commercially-run passenger vehicles, rose by 0.9% month-on-month to 7.60 million tons.
- Sales of gasoline in December slipped 4.5% from the previous month to 2.99 million tons.
- Sales of sports utility vehicles rose in December, while small car sales fell despite high discounts, data from Indian automakers showed last week.
- Car sales remain strong, which does bode well for demand, but new cars are fuel efficient. Some car travel restrictions might remain in the winter, but the situation is likely to start improving in February," UI Haq said.
- Sales of bitumen, used for making roads, rose by 12.9% from November, while fuel oil use increased by 9.6% in December.
- Cooking gas, or liquefied petroleum gas, sales rose by 5.6% to 2.63 million tons, while naphtha sales jumped by 27.9% to about 1.33 million tons, the data showed.

### MARKET UPDATES: CRUDE

#### India's crude oil imports from Russia jump 3% in December from last month

- India's crude oil imports from Russia increased around 3 percent in December from the previous month.
- In December, India imported 1.52 million barrels per day (bpd) of Russian crude oil, compared to 1.48 million bpd in November. Russia retained the position of top supplier of crude oil to India in the last month of the year.
- The jump in India's imports of crude oil from Russia comes after month-on-month decline in supply from the country in October and November.
- The decline in imports were seen amid narrowing discounts on Russian oil and payment issues faced by refiners as cost of oil surpasses the price cap.
- Russia, which used to supply around 0.2 percent of India's total oil requirement, has emerged as the largest supplier to the country after the Russia-Ukraine war.
- The Eurasian country diverted its oil to Asian countries, especially India and China, at discounted rates ever since the European Union (EU) and the US imposed a slew of sanctions on Moscow after the invasion of Ukraine.
- Russia has become a major source of crude oil for India ever since Moscow sent troops to Ukraine in February 2022, and has overtaken Saudi Arabia and Iraq to become the biggest supplier of the commodity.
- Meawhile, the traditional crude oil suppliers Iraq and Saudi Arabia provided 1 million bpd and 65,000 bpd of crude oil respectively to India in the month of December. India's total import of crude oil in December was 4.44 million bpd.
